Cap Arcona

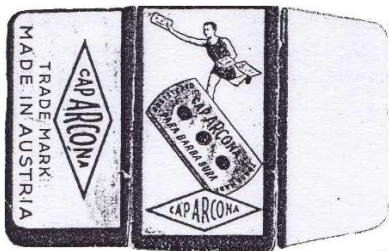

Hamburg-South America Line

Some other ships of the line also had their razor blades:
